The Inspector has postponed the session on Congleton (and all other sessions on localities); at the time of writing this report a revised date has not been provided. *MS passed a letter to PM from the inspector S.J.Pratt to CEBC which indicated that whilst there is a planned date of early December but he does point out that this may have to be put back again whilst CEBC consider the implications of his initial views on the legal compliance and soundness of the submitted plans.*

CCC/SECCAG - P.Hall

Cheshire East held their second cycling seminar at Congleton Town Hall on Wednesday 2 October. The main item was CE's appointment of a transport consultancy to help CE develop their 'Cycling Strategy' which must be completed by March 2015. The council plan to register for this initiative.

This strategy is a Government initiative which will encourage councils to promote cycling in their areas.

One point that CCC finds very important is that all planning applications will be required to add cycle friendly facilities, not only within the development but also to make sure that walkers and cyclists can get from the new development to any part of the town. IF this is made to work this will be most welcome.

This has been a requirement of local authorities for some years but, in the words of Cllr Michael Jones leader of CE, the developers could ignore the council's requests because 'they can afford better lawyers than CE'!

We wait to see how the new 'strategy' will make this happen.

1.	Vale Allotments.	
	The community asset request has now been granted by Cheshire East. The site has been registered as an Asset of Community Value under the Localism Act 2011, and the rights to buy scheme. The landowner has been made aware of the situation and we have been advised that he has informed CEBC of his intention to sell the site. This now invokes 2 trigger points. (1) The owner cannot sell for 6 weeks and this ends 4.12.14. (2) If a community group (or a group that fits the legislation criteria) advises CEBC of its intention to make a bid for the land then a further 6 months of waiting before disposal is triggered. It should be noted that the owner does not have to accept that groups offer and can sell to someone else if he or she so wishes. It was decided to set up a task/subgroup to see how we take this issue forward. They will look at the area of publicity through the use of local media (Chronicle / Cheshire Borders Independent
