5. Chairs Reports

Commenting Team - P.Minshull.

1. Planning Application – 242 homes at Moss Farm, Manchester Road

PM prepared and submitted objections on behalf of CSG to the planning applications for the 143 homes in phase 1 (14/4451C) and 99 homes in phase 2 (14/4452C) at Moss Farm, Manchester Road. While we do not object to the principle of development at this site the detail leaves much to be desired in respect of sustainability, road safety etc.

2. Planning Application - 220 homes off Canal Road

PM is currently preparing a response on behalf of CSG to this application which is a re-application of an earlier application which was refused by CEBC. Some amendments to the layout have been made but our objections to the principle of development at this site remain. The closing date is 11th December. PM is working on a letter to send to planning stressing this.

3. Congleton Neighbourhood Plan

PM, **SF and PA** have been invited to attend the workshops preparing the Congleton Neighbourhood Plan. The first meeting will be held on 3rd December.

4. CEBC Local Plan

The Inspector's interim findings are with CEBC who will need to decide how they wish to proceed. The most likely way forward is for CEBC to try to address the issues raised by the inspector over the next 6 months and then recommence the hearings.

CCC/SECCAG - P.Hall

The debate regarding cycling in Bridge St continues. We are told that CE are going to put up 'no cycling' signs despite CCC asking for exemptions during the same time as loading for vehicles. This information comes via the letters pages of the Chronicle and I am trying to get confirmation from CE.

A meeting was held with CE regarding complementary sustainable transport measures on the Congleton Link Road.

We were led to believe that because of the state of the Local Plan there could be some doubt about whether the whole scheme would go ahead!!!!!

We were advised that there are some cycling measures included in the scheme. In our opinion they might as well not bother as these schemes only funnel cyclists onto the existing busy Rood Hill and West Road. We suggest some much larger cycling/walking scheme that gets people to the town centre without using the busy roads. We were advised the only way this could happen is via the Neighbourhood Plan.

We have asked Brian Hogan to be see if the CCC can be consulted as part of the process.

PH reported that at a recent Northern Rail Cycle Forum there was a promise of 24 covered cycle parking spaces at Congleton Railway Station, PH would like them to be split across both platforms.

CEBC looking to support new signage on the routes from Staffs border to Macclesfield and around town routes.

Eco Schools - P.Pinto

We have **13 schools with Green Flags**, three schools at silver (W. Well, EBA, CHS) working towards GF. Six schools have achieved or renewed their green flags so far in 2014, two more to renew on 26 November.

APPLE JUICE. "Last year Alan at Dunham Massey said he would retain some of our apple juice and try and make some cider as he'd been experimenting with his own apple juice too. Suffice to say the experiments were very successful and so now we have Congleton Sustainability Group Medium Dry Cider and Medium Dry Cider & Blackcurrent, both in 500ml bottles available to buy at Barley Hops on the corner Swan Bank (link here to http://barleyhops.co.uk/), Congleton and available to drink at Reuben Stubbs restaurant in Lawton Street (link here to http://www.insideoutcatering.co.uk/reuben-stubbs.html"

We have around 880 bottles of Apple Juice produced for this year and have 500ltrs of juice set aside which should produce around 1000 bottles of Cider. The licence is now in hand and we will be able to sell cider from December on.
