	PA advised the meeting that the next stage was the issuing of a second questionnaire which should be out in the next few days.
1.	Group Reports.
	Report from the Commenting Team for November 2015
	Tall Ash Farm – 250 dwellings off Buxton Road
	This application was considered again at the November meeting of the Strategic Planning Board and PM spoke, but due to the change in arrangements for speaking, not on behalf of CSG. It is very disappointing that the Board approved the application,
	although, due to comments from PM an additional condition was added requiring the developer to pay for a signalised crossing
	of Buxton Road – but there is no evidence that this will fully address road safety issues.
	Due to a local resident making an earlier request via Fiona Bruce MP this application will be considered by the National Planning
	Casework Unit at DCLG with a view to it being 'called in', i.e. going to appeal (despite being approved by CEBC). There is no
	certainty what the outcome of the review will be; we will just have to wait.
	2. PM meeting with Fiona Bruce MP
	PM met with Fiona Bruce regarding what he considers to be the less than adequate consideration of road safety by CEBC when assessing planning applications, with particular reference to the Seddon Homes development off Canal Road. At the meeting at
	the request of Fiona, PM wrote to her raising these issues and particularly highlighting the recent fatal accident at High
	Street/Canal Street, which occurred after the appeal had closed.
	3. Congleton Neighbourhood Plan – Transport Group
	The Transport Group met at the end of last month and following this, the second version of the Travel Survey was produced
	along with the first draft of the transport policies. Both documents have been submitted to BH. PM attended the NP Steering

Group meeting where it was agreed that the Travel Survey should be separate from the second round NP questionnaire. PM was asked to prepare a draft brief for technical support for the survey.

4. Congleton Link Road

PM prepared and submitted a response on behalf of CSG. While we are in favour of the principle of the Link Road, PM raised a number of detail issues.

PM indicated that CSG / Local organisations and groups would in future find it difficult to speak at Planning Meetings due to a change of rules by CEBC. This item to be discussed more fully in January when P.Minshull is present.
