10. **Group Report.**

Commenting Team for January 2016

1. Tall Ash Farm – 250 dwellings off Buxton Road

This application is still being considered by the National Planning Casework Unit at DCLG with a view to it being 'called in', i.e. going to appeal (despite being approved by CEBC). There is no certainty what the outcome of the review will be; we will just have to wait.

PM and Anna Morrison are still waiting for the responses to their Stage 2 complaints with Cheshire East Council on the way this application was dealt with.

2. Seddon Homes development – 230 dwellings off Canal Road

PM has written to Brandon Lewis MP, the Minister of State for planning, regard the very serious issues raised by the Inspector's decision on this appeal; the letter was copied to Fiona Bruce (who has acknowledged) and Caroline Simpson at Cheshire East Council (who has not). PM has asked for a meeting with the Minister to discuss these issues; we will have wait and see if this request is taken up.

3. Congleton Neighbourhood Plan – Transport Group

PM has prepared a first draft of a brief for technical support for the proposed travel survey and this has been forwarded to David McGifford for review as the contract would be with Congleton TC. PM attended the Steering Group meeting. The

Transport Group will meet again in February to work with Andrew Thompson on the transport policies, the brief for the travel survey and review the responses from the second round questionnaire.

Apple Juice. Nearly sold out. Just going to the usual retail outlets and holding some back for Food & Drink. No Rode Hall for the time being.

Cider. Kings Arms still selling well.

Part of the Strategy is the production of a Network Map covering the whole CE. CE's idea is to create a cycle network that links all the towns in CE.
