PM has received a response to his Stage 2 complaint with Cheshire East Council on the way this application was dealt with. Unfortunately the response is unsatisfactory and PM is considering escalating the complaint to the Ombudsman.

2. Seddon Homes development – 230 dwellings off Canal Road

PM has received responses to the letter he sent to Brandon Lewis MP, the Minister of State for Planning, regard the very serious issues raised by the Inspector's decision. Responses have been received from the Planning Inspectorate (not the Minister) and from Caroline Simpson at Cheshire East Council. Again neither response is satisfactory. PM together with Anna Morrison met with Fiona Bruce to discuss these responses and planning/development in Congleton in general. Mrs Bruce considered that a meeting with the Minister would only illicit the same response and it was reluctantly agreed that there is nothing further that can be done on this matter.
