Commenting Team.

1. Seddon Development off Canal Road

Following the decision by the CEBC Southern Planning Committee on 29th March to defer a decision due to a number of concerns including our concern of insufficient bungalows (contrary to the Local Plan and emerging Congleton Neighbourhood Plan) the developer has increased the number of bungalows from 4 to 6 (all semi-detached). This is still inadequate so PM has written to CEBC making the case for significantly more bungalows. The application will go to the May meeting of the SPC (31st May) and PM will speak to try and increase the number of bungalows.

PM reported that following the 31st May meeting all reserved matters were rubber stamped with a small improvement around

the traffic control of the emergency access onto Moody St.

2. Congleton Neighbourhood Plan - Transport Group

PM represented the Transport Group at the NP steering group meeting on 11th May. The meeting reviewed the draft NP in advance of going to Regulation 14 consultation.

3. PM to contact A.Arnold CEBC Planning Dept to discuss planning process issues.

Cycling report.

Second visit from Sustrans to look at creating a working cycle network took place on 30 May. Full report now due early June. They have done an extra day of survey for nothing because of the delay in producing the initial report.

CE have asked the campaign to submit a 'network map' for the town and our desired links to other towns. The Sustrans survey will feed into this.

Stop press

Cheshire Police are hosting a cycle awareness day on June 29 at the HQ in Winsford.

This is in response to 'Space for Cycling' initiative from Cycling UK and has been trialled by West Midlands Police. Plainclothes officers on bikes are reporting drivers who pass cyclists too close to colleagues further down the road. The offending drivers are then stopped, spoken to and can be sent on awareness courses. There will also be sessions on crap cycling too, just to balance the piece.
